- 1. (a) A person is obliged to proffer assistance, when able to do so without endangering himself or his fellow, to a person who, in close proximity, and following a sudden event, is subject to a serious and immediate danger to his life, his person, or his health.

- (b) If that person notifies the authorities or calls upon another person who can proffer the required assistance, then he shall be deemed as though he proffered assistance for the purposes of this Law: in this Section, "authorities" the police, the ambulance services [Magen David Adom], and the fire-fighting services.
- 2. (a) The provisions of Section 5 of the Unjust Enrichment Law, 5739-1979,² shall apply, notwithstanding that the person providing the benefit acted in accordance with his obligation under Section 1.

(b) The Court may order the party responsible for causing the danger that the rescued person was subject to, including the rescued person himself if he caused the danger, to indemnify the person who proffered Section 1, for reasonable costs and expenses that he incurred.

- 3. Save as otherwise provided by Section 2 (a) Saving of this Law the provisions of this Law shall of Powers not derogate from the provisions of any other enactment.
- 4. A person in breach of the provisions of **Penalties** Section 1 of this Law shall be subject to a fine.
- 5. The Minister of Justice is charged with the Implementation implementation of this Law.
- 6. This Law shall come into force upon the commencement expiration of 90 days from the date of its publication [in Reshumot].
